**COURSE INTRODUCTION:**

We will be examining the global legal process in the world today; its evolution, the changes, the controversies, and recent developments. Focus will be on the critical cases that have influenced International Law of the years. You are expected to gain the knowledge for case law and apply it to your research assignments.
