Call to Order by Pres. Bazayev at 3:00 pm.

Public Comments on Agenda Item(s): None.

Consideration of Dec. 1, 2022 minutes: Robert Cook moved to approve. Passed by acclamation.

President's Report:

--**Zero-Based Budget and Graduate Student Stipends** Committees continue to meet and FSEC continues to convey faculty concerns. Report from ZBB submitted to the provost on Friday, Jan. 20. FSEC is pushing for the report to be made public.

--**Extreme building temperatures** (below 60 and above 90) continue to have a negative impact on faculty productivity and teaching. FSEC has asked that a representative from Facility Services attend the Feb. Faculty senate meeting to answer questions and to provide a time line for remedying the problems. Senators are asked to urge the members of their units to report all problems to as many channels as are available. An email outlining those channels was sent to all senators after the meeting.

--**Problem with Fall 22 student evaluations** resolved in that evaluations submitted after the initial deadline were only released at the request of the instructor. Robert Cook asked that Bazayev demand a written commitment that no late evals will be released to any administrators. Bazayev agreed.

--**PM-11** (concerning outside employment contracts) delays in obtaining approval should now be resolved, after discussions with Academic Affairs. Other concerns with the policy memorandum still exist and are the subject of discussion between FSEC and Academic Affairs.

--The new **Faculty Senate website** is up and running. Senators are asked to look it over and report any problems to Bazayev.

--FS administrative coordinator Sarah Williamson Richard is leaving for another position, effective January 24. Bazayev and Vice-President Tirone have initiated the process with HR for hiring a replacement.

New Business

Resolution 23-01, “Resolution to Expand Retirement Choices for LSU Employees”

Sponsored by the Benefits Advisory Committee

Roy Heidelberg introduced the resolution and noted that the Benefits Advisory Committee is working with the Staff Senate on a companion resolution. He also noted the importance of communicating with faculty on this issue, and of President Tate and the administration working with the LA Senate.

The ensuing discussion ranged widely, with many senators seeking further details as to the content of the legislation within the Louisiana Senate Finance Committee and the implementation of the new policy, should it pass into LA law. Senators expressed interest in the Benefits Advisory Committee pursuing a separate resolution RE inflation pressures on TSRL pensions.

Presentation by Keli Zinn, Executive Deputy Director and COO of LSU Athletics, and Clay Harris, Deputy Director of Athletics for Revenue Generation, on LSU’s contract with Caesar’s Sportbook

Harris gave an overview of the Caesar’s Partnership:

--Caesar’s receives access to prime signage, radio spots, tv spots, print, lsusports.net and use of LSU logo.

--LSU Athletics receives in exchange lots of money. No figures given but Caesar’s is now one of the highest donors to LSU Athletics.

--contract runs thru 2026

Harris emphasized that Caesar’s agreed to “responsibility messaging”—usually in the form of a banner giving a phone number to call if viewer has a gambling problem. He noted that their research shows that 97% of LSU fans overall and 91% of LSU fans at football games are over age 21.

Zinn noted that the broadcast email sent out to all students and faculty (urging us all to place our first bet thru the Caesar’s app) was the product of serious human error and would not happen again, and that Caesar’s does not target minors.

The ensuing question and answer period was lively, with many senators expressing skepticism about the insistence that minors were not targeted and dismay over LSU Athletics’ willingness to place revenue ahead of both student welfare and the university’s stated mission.

Other points of note:

- LSU Sports Properties, the exclusive marketing & multimedia rights holder of LSU Athletics since 2005, is a private corporation, a separate legal entity from LSU, and not subject to public disclosure laws. All agreements thru LSU Sports Properties are protected; the secrecy surrounding the contract with Caesar’s was not unique.
- According to Zinn, the contract with Caesar’s was approved “by the university.” The contract was signed before she came to LSU Athletics and so she said she did not know who in the university approved it. After being questioned by Joan King, Zinn agreed to find out who did so and to inform the Faculty Senate.
- No faculty committee consults with LSU Sports Properties.
